

Rescuing and rehoming abandoned dogs

Saving lives since 1982

Dogwatch Sanctuary Trust is a registered charity formed in 1982. We rescue, care for and rehome dogs that have been abandoned at pounds in Christchurch and Canterbury.

After seven days at the pound, dogs that haven't been claimed or adopted can legally be put down. On the eighth day, if kennel space is available at Dogwatch, we take legal ownership of any dog the Council deems adoptable. We bring them to our purpose-built adoption centre in Bromley where we care for them until we find them a forever home



At Dogwatch, each dog has a warm indoor sleeping area and a large outdoor yard. They're exercised 2-3 times a day in our 3-acre paddock (complete with purposedesigned swimming pond) and stimulated with toys, agility equipment, interaction with our team and socialisation with other dogs.

They are loved and cared for by our small team of experienced staff and over 80 volunteers. We all believe that every dog deserves a second chance and we work hard to make that a reality.



Adoption Things to think about

Before you adopt a dog you need to ask yourself some important questions, and carefully consider what you are undertaking.

- Fencing: Is your fencing (including gates) an appropriate height and of solid construction to safely contain your dog
- Size and Space: How much room do you have? Where will your dog sleep? Is your property suitable for the type of dog you are considering?
- Time, Permanence and Stability: Dogs are energetic pack animals who can live up to 15 years. They need plenty of exercise, mental stimulation, stability and security to lead a happy, healthy life. Many dogs will become stressed if left alone for too many hours every day. Do you have the time to put into your dog?
- Tenancy: If you rent your property you will need to get written permission from your landlord to have a dog on the property.
- Cost: Registration, vaccines, food, holiday boarding, and vet expenses for illness or injury.
- Lifestyle: It is important to choose a dog whose energy level suits your lifestyle. Destructive behaviour can be a sign of stress, boredom or frustration.

Dogs will give you love and loyalty if they are cared for properly.

Our Dogs

The dogs we rescue are mostly mixed breed, of varying sizes and energy levels and range from puppies to seniors.
